



Today's self-storage facilities look better than ever - and a part of that curb appeal comes from good landscaping. As you think about your landscape plan, consider how it will age as well, and what level of maintenance will be needed. Using stone instead of wood mulch for example may cost more up front but will be easier to maintain in the future. Consider the mature size of tree and bushes, avoiding future crowding or leaves in clogging your building gutters.
